English Language Arts:

4 Units including literature, composition and speech



Mathematics: 3 Units



Social Studies:

3 units including 1 unit of US history, 1/2 unit government,
1/2 unit economics



Science:

3 units including 1 unit physical and 1 unit biology



Physical Education: 1 Unit



3 Units of: a. Foreign language, b. Native American Language,
c. fine arts, or d. career or technical



Electives: 5 units

*a unit of credit is 120 clock hours, For science and lab subjects a unit credit is 150 clock hours

ND Homeschool Law In Short

1. You must file a statement of intent with your superintendent of schools 2 weeks before you begin school for children age 7-16.
2. Parent must hold a high school diploma, GED or have a certified monitor in order to home educate.
3. Parent must teach subjects required by law to be taught in public school
4. You may opt out of standardized testing, however, if you choose not to, tests are to be given at gradess 4, 6, 8, and 10.
5. You need to maintain annual records of courses taken and the child's academic progress.
6. You must school a minimum of 175 days a year and 4 hours a day.

Record Keeping

- Keep, at minimum, a sample of work from each subject - examples would be tests and major projects, also lesson plans or journals
- Make a record sheet for each student *
- Keep a report card for each student *

Minimum Elementary Curriculum Requirements

CENTURY CODE INCLUDE:

English Language Arts:

including reading, composition, creative writing, English grammar, and spelling



Mathematics



Social Studies:

including US Constitution US History, Geography, Government, and ND Studies (required in 4th, 8th, and 10th grade)



Science:

including agriculture



Phy Ed - Health:

including physiology, hygiene, disease control, nature and effects of alcohol
tobacco and narcotics

*note that each of these subsections do not need to be included in each grade, just at some point in grades 1-8
